But then something changed Tully's whole life. In his newspaper, he published some negative articles about a well-known lawyer of his city. The lawyer became very angry with Tully and he decided to investigate Tully's personal life. Soon, he discovered that Tully was a liar. He publicized the fact that Tully told untrue stories about himself. In 30 this way, everybody learnt about the real Tully.

Tully immediately admitted being dishonest and resigned from his job. He put himself in the care of a psychiatrist in order to discover why he did this. And the fantasy lifestyle of "Duke" Tully ended.


